| Key questions | -What is a rhetorical device? <br> -Why are they useful? <br> - How do we use them in everyday communication? <br> - How can we use them? <br> - What is viral communication? What's a meme? <br> -What do you like about memes? <br> - Are rhetorical devices important in memes? |
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| Development | At home, students read a list of rhetorical devices with examples from literature and journalism. <br> In the class the teacher explains the main devices and shows graphic examples (photos, audiovisual, etc.) (10'). <br> Participants organize themselves into groups and produce memes. Each meme should represent - through a combination of text and image - a rhetorical device. (30'). <br> There are many websites and mobile apps that allow users to create and download memes. Ask your students or look for them online. (5'). <br> The activity finishes with an exhibition of the productions and final discussion about rhetorical and viral circulation of information (25'). |
